STUDENT SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR 2026-27

ARAPAHOE COMMUNITY COLLEGE (ACC)

DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:



New, first time to college DSF Scholars in their first semester must:

- Check in with the Campus Contact within 30 days of the beginning of each semester.
 - The Campus Contact will connect them with campus programs, engagement opportunities, and resources, and provide any DSF or ACC updates.
- Complete ACC new student orientation prior to first semester.
- Participate in at least one engagement opportunity.



RENEWAL DSF SCHOLARS MUST:

- Check in with the Campus Contact within 60 days of the beginning of each semester.
 - The Campus Contact will review the student's academic performance and engagement on campus at that time and make appropriate referrals, including support with career exploration and preparation, and provide any DSF or ACC updates.



All DSF Scholars must participate in at least one (1) career coaching and readiness service during the academic year.

Options include:

- Attending a Career Fair hosted by ACC
- Attending a Career Panel hosted by ACC
- Attending a Career Event hosted by the Community
- Attending a Virtual Panel hosted by DSF
- Meeting with a Career Specialist
- Connecting with Employers in Handshake
- Creating a LinkedIn Profile or Completion of LinkedIn Learning Course
