STUDENT SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR 2026-27

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (CMU)

DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:

All DSF Scholars must make substantial progress (evaluated by the DSF Campus Contact) on their Student Success Requirements by **Friday, October 30, 2026**, for the fall semester and by **Friday, April 16, 2027**, for the spring semester.



ALL DSF SCHOLARS:

Meet with the DSF Campus Contact at least twice each semester. These meetings provide valuable information and support to help you succeed in college. Your DSF Campus Contact's information is listed on the side.

Your Campus Contact can:

- Connect you with campus programs that support academic success and campus connection, and make appropriate referrals.
- Discuss major declaration, developmental education progress, anticipated graduation date, graduation course planning, meetings with academic advisors, and other academic topics.
- **New and incoming transfer DSF Scholars** must complete their first check-in within the first four weeks of the semester.
- **Continuing DSF Scholars** (sophomore through senior year) must complete their first check-in within the first eight weeks of the semester.



COMPLETE A GRADUATION PLAN IN DEGREEWORKS

- Graduation plan must be updated annually and signed by faculty advisor.
- New and incoming transfer DSF Scholars must complete a four-year graduation plan within the first four weeks of the semester and submit it to their DSF Campus Contact to keep on file.
- Continuing DSF Scholars (sophomore through senior year) must have their four-year graduation plan signed by their faculty advisor within the first eight weeks of the fall semester.



ATTEND AT LEAST THREE EVENTS EACH SEMESTER:

- Fall/Spring Semester Kick-Off Event
- One Professional/Career Event
- One Academic/Campus Connection Event



COMPLETE TWO STUDENT SUCCESS ONLINE WORKSHOPS EACH SEMESTER THROUGH THE FIRST-GEN+ SUPPORT CENTER.

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Additional support structures in place for DSF Students:

You will be automatically assigned to a DSF Community in D2L, where you can track your requirements alongside your classes. You will also receive important updates, event information, and upcoming deadlines from your DSF Campus Contact.

You will remain on IRIS Academic Advising caseloads for the full time of your enrollment.

You will receive 4-week and 7-week early alerts/feedback from your professors each semester regarding your academic status.

You will receive weekly reminder emails about events, requirements, important campus dates, and helpful information and encouragement.

Students on probation or DSF funding suspension will be required to complete a Success Plan within the first week of the probation semester with their DSF Contact and Academic Advisor of record. Plans may include additional CAS tutoring, accountability check-ins, academic mentoring, and resource navigation.

TRIO STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES
