STUDENT SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR 2025-26

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES

DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:



ALL DSF SCHOLARS:

All DSF Students are required to attend a minimum of two events per semester.

- One DSF Community event or PASCAL Center cross-scholar community event; AND
- One VIP Professional Development or Limitless Leaders Speaker Series event through the PASCAL Center.



NEW/TRANSFER DSF SCHOLARS:

- Must check-in with their DSF Campus Contact within 30 days of the beginning of class each semester.
- First-year undergraduates must take CSM 101: Freshman Success Seminar in either the DSF Scholars section or the First-Generation section. DSF scholars will be automatically enrolled in one of these sections. If a scholar wishes to switch to a different section, they must first get approval from the PASCAL Center Director. Transfer students are not required to take CSM 101.
