METROPOLITAN STATE UNIVERSITY OF DENVER (MSU DENVER)

DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:



ALL DSF SCHOLARS (NEW, RENEWAL, TRANSFER):

- DSF Scholars will complete Student Success Requirements (SSRs) no later than **Friday, November 14, 2025, for the Fall semester**, and no later than **Friday, April 17, 2026, for the Spring semester**. Student Success Requirements include:



Meet with your DSF Campus Advisor

- Freshmen: 3 meetings each semester
- Sophomores - Seniors: 2 meetings each semester

DSF SCHOLARS ON PROBATION/WARNING STATUS MUST:

Each scholarship requirement will be tracked, submitted, and completed via a unique Canvas assignment. SPACETECH SCHOLARS

SpaceTech Scholars will increase the recruitment, retention, graduation and career placement rates of underrepresented students (i.e., Hispanic, female-identifying, other minority, low-income, first-generation, and/or student veteran) as aspiring professionals in the domains of aerospace science and engineering.

TRIO STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES (SSS)

ACCESS CENTER
