## OTERO COLLEGE (OC)

**DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:**



### ALL DSF SCHOLARS:

Must meet with the DSF Campus Contact at least once during each semester. These meetings provide you with valuable information to help you succeed in college. Your DSF Campus Contact's information is listed on the side.

Your Campus contact can:



Connect you with campus programs aimed at encouraging academic and social engagement on campus, and make appropriate referrals.

Discuss major declaration, developmental education progress, anticipated graduation date, graduation course plan, meetings with academic advisors, etc.



### NEW/TRANSFER DSF SCHOLARS:



Must check-in with their DSF Campus Contact within 30 days of the beginning of class each semester.



### RETURNING DSF SCHOLARS:



Required to check-in with their DSF Campus Contact within 60 days of the beginning of class each semester.

## Student Support Programs

The Denver Scholarship Foundation wants every college student to successfully complete a college degree or certificate. Below are some helpful resources and programs that are available at OC.



### TRIO STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES (SSS)

The program is focused toward students who have one or more of the following factors: first-generation, low-income or disabled. The goal of the program is to increase the college retention and graduation rates of its participants and help students make the transition from one level of higher education to the next.



### AIM PROGRAM

The AIM program serves Otero's entire student population by promoting educational opportunities through orientation, mentoring, advising, and case management. Faculty, staff and peer mentors are matched with students to help acquaint students with the Otero culture, provide information on services, careers, and give general support to the student throughout their academic experience at Otero. Students can also work with faculty to gain experience related to their studies outside the classroom and to develop research projects



### PRESIDENT'S LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The mission of the program is to develop and train emerging leaders at Otero College through a one or two-year academic leadership program that is focused on academics, service and experiential learning.
