STUDENT SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR 2026-27

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO BOULDER (CU BOULDER)

DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:



ALL DSF SCHOLARS:

DSF Scholars will complete Student Success Requirements (SSRs) no later than Friday, October 30, 2026 (Fall semester) and Friday, April 16, 2027 (Spring semester). Student Success Requirements include:

- Check-in with your student success team once per semester. Your main campus contact will communicate steps on how to set this up at the beginning of the semester.
 - New/transfer students must check-in within 30 days of the start of the semester
 - Renewal students must check-in within 60 days of the start of the semester
- Participate in an approved student success opportunity. These opportunities include support with academics, career and professional development, and community building.
 - Examples will be provided by your DSF campus contact.
- Participate in an approved career event or opportunity. These opportunities include support with career exploration, career development, attending a career event, and experiences on campus, off campus, or with DSF.
 - Examples will be provided by your DSF campus contact.
- CU Boulder has a wide variety of student success programs that we partner with. Actively participating in an approved program can satisfy Student Success Requirements, pending Campus Contact approval. Examples are listed below.



KEEPING TRACK

- Your progress will be monitored through a Canvas course to which you will be automatically assigned. Your campus contact team will provide guidance on how to submit your completed SSRs.
- Additionally, you will receive essential updates, information on events, and deadlines.
