# UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO COLORADO SPRINGS (UCCS)

## DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:



### ALL DSF SCHOLARS:

Must meet with the DSF Campus Contact at least once during each semester. These meetings provide you with valuable information to help you succeed in college. Your DSF Campus Contact's information is listed on the side.

Your Campus contact can:



Connect you with campus programs aimed at encouraging academic and social engagement on campus, and make appropriate referrals.

Discuss major declaration, developmental education progress, anticipated graduation date, graduation course plan, meetings with academic advisors, etc.

Complete the Passport for Retention, which will document participation in various on-campus activities and meetings with an Academic Advisor, by November 1 for Fall semester and April 1 for Spring semester, in addition to meeting with the DSF Campus Contact for semester check-ins.



### NEW/TRANSFER DSF SCHOLARS:



Must check-in within 30 days of the beginning of each semester.

New first time to college DSF Scholars must participate in the Gateway Program Seminar (GPS). The program requires students to register for a(3)credit course where they become both academically and socially connected to a small group of about (15) other freshmen.



### RETURNING DSF SCHOLARS:



Must check-in within 60 days of the beginning of each semester.

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## Student Support Programs

The Denver Scholarship Foundation wants every college student to successfully complete a college degree or certificate. Below are some helpful resources and programs that are available at UCCS.

### FIRST2GO

A program for first-generation students to see and meet peers, faculty, and staff who are/were also first-generation students.

### GATEWAY PROGRAM SEMINAR

A unique, academic course designed for the interests and needs of UCCS freshmen. This required course exposes students to in-depth analysis of an interdisciplinary topic or academic discipline while also preparing first year students for academic and psychological adjustments to college life.

### MOSAIC GATEWAY PROGRAM

Provides holistic admission review and learning communities for students who face particular academic and social challenges but show strong potential to succeed in college. The learning community is designed to provide added layers of support needed to promote academic and social success for MOSAIC Scholars.
