STUDENT SUCCESS REQUIREMENTS FOR 2026-27

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO DENVER (CU DENVER)

DSF Scholars must complete the following to maintain scholarship eligibility each semester:



ALL DSF SCHOLARS (NEW, RENEWAL, TRANSFER):

DSF Scholars will complete Student Success Requirements (SSRs) no later than **Friday, November 13, 2026, for the Fall semester**, and no later than **Friday, April 16, 2027, for the Spring semester**. Student Success Requirements include:



MEET WITH YOUR DSF CAMPUS ADVISOR:

- Freshmen: 3 meetings each semester
- Sophomores - Seniors: 2 meetings each semester

STAYING ON TRACK:

- Students will be added to a DSF Canvas course once they are confirmed as DSF Scholars at the start of each academic term. SSRs will be tracked, submitted, and completed via a unique Canvas assignment for each SSRs. SSR assignments will require uploaded proof of completion and/or a written submission detailing the completed SSR. Incomplete assignments will not allow the student to meet the scholarship requirements. Complete your FAFSA/CASFA application by 'priority deadline'.

CENTER FOR ACCESS & CAMPUS ENGAGEMENT

The Center for Access and Campus Engagement (CACE) aims to address the opportunity gaps in higher education by implementing research-based programs and high-impact practices designed to increase the educational access for all undergraduate students at the University of Colorado Denver (CU Denver).

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REISHER SCHOLARS

The Reisher Scholars Program provides post-secondary educational opportunities for Colorado students through scholarship grants at in-state schools. The objective is to enable promising students from Colorado, who do not have sufficient financial resources, to graduate from college in a timely manner with minimal additional educational debt. This scholarship is only for undergraduate students working towards their first bachelor's degree. It is both merit and need-based.

FIRST GENERATION & MULTICULTURAL (FaM) BUSINESS PROGRAM

The First-Generation and Multicultural (FaM) Business Program is a comprehensive program designed to increase support and opportunities for first-generation college and multicultural students. FaM is unique to the CU Denver Business School. It is a program for students of any race or any racial background which we define as multicultural.

FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCES

The focus of the CU Denver First-Year Experiences program is specially-designed courses that provide a welcoming and supportive learning environment for our new degree-seeking students who are starting college for the first time in the fall semester.

WRITING CENTER

The academy provides newly admitted first-year students who meet certain requirements based on their application and who will start in the fall semester the opportunity to enroll in 2-7 credit hours over the summer.
